

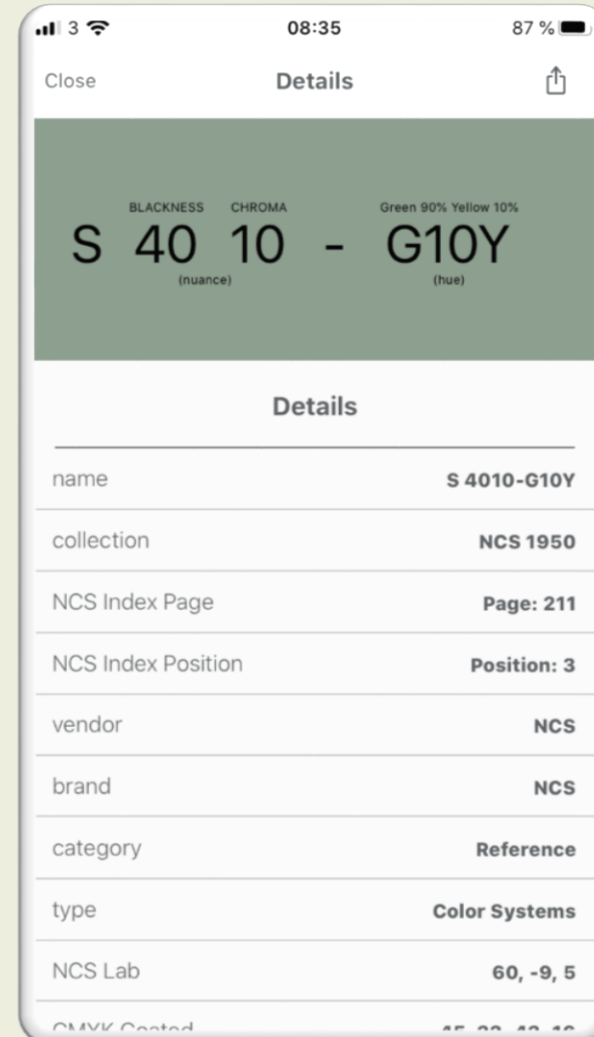
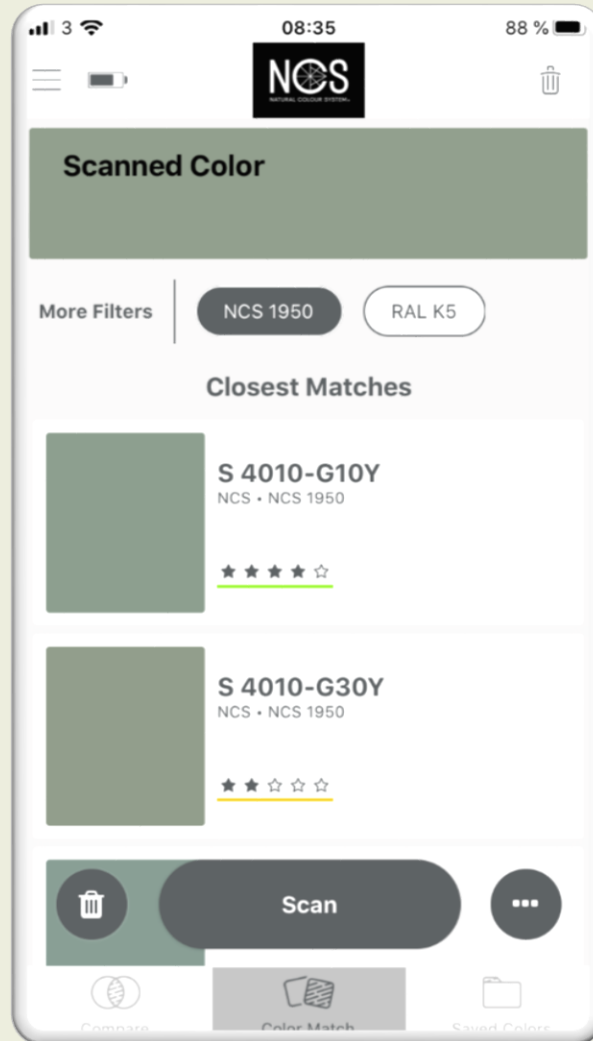
NCS Colourpin App update

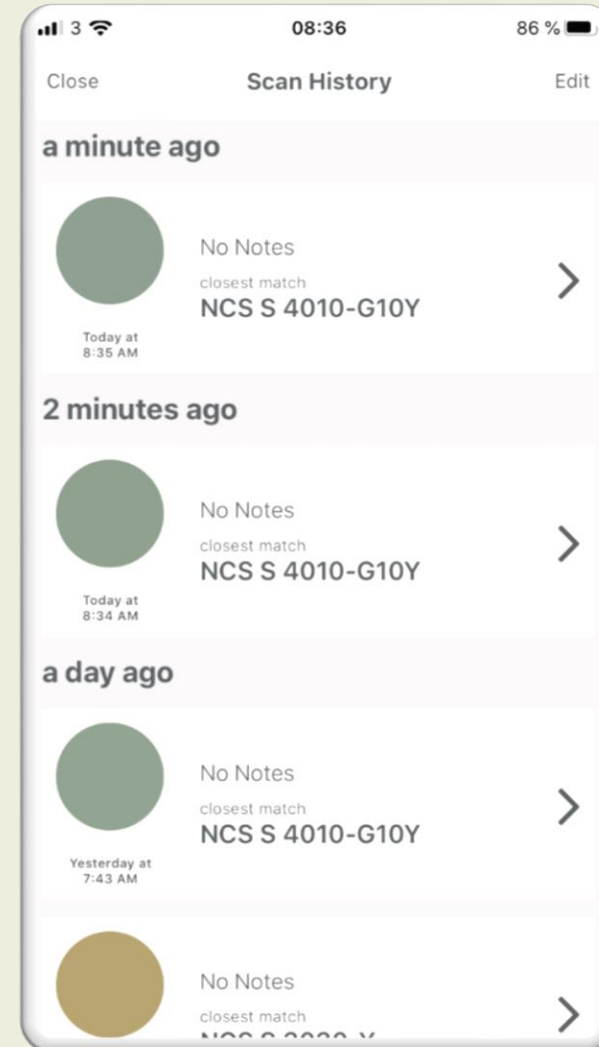
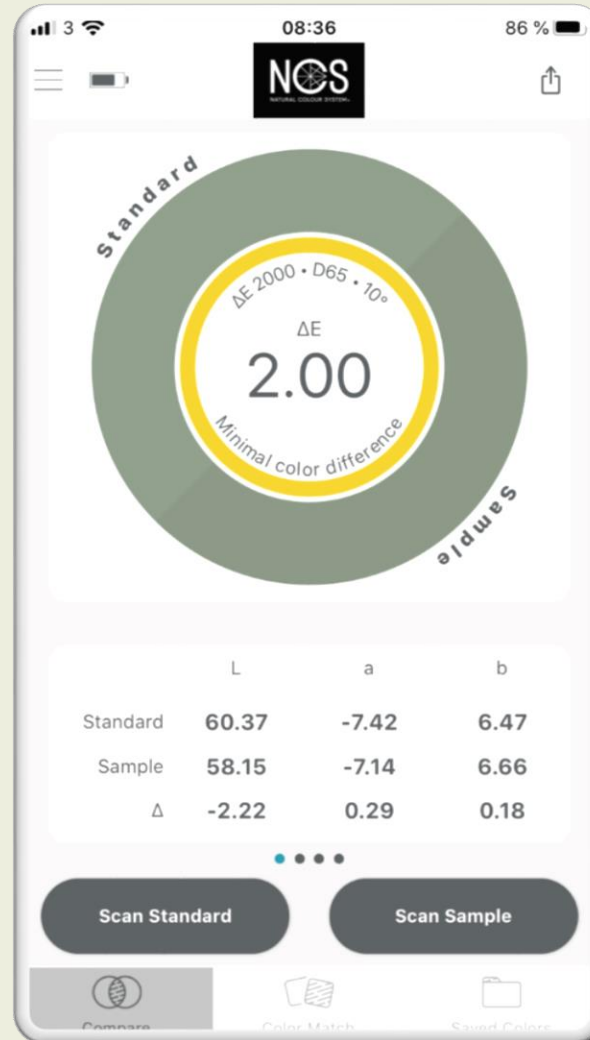
New Interface

- The functions are the same but it looks a little different.
 - The stars are still the indication of how close you are to the NCS Standard Colour but no Delta E
 - When you click on the colour there is an NCS reference in how to read the NCS notation
 - Chroma will be updated, should be Chromaticness



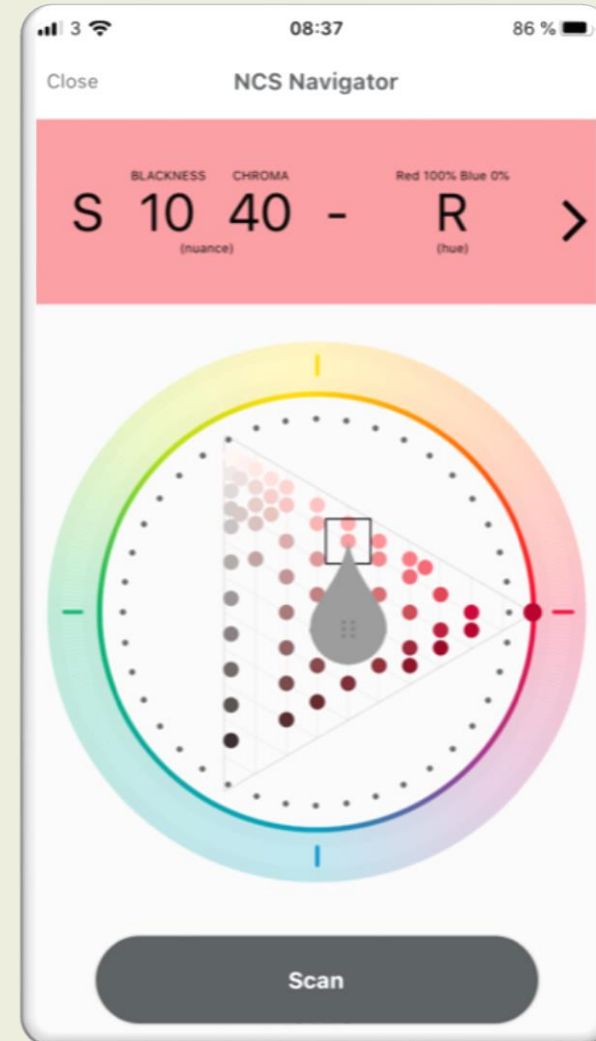
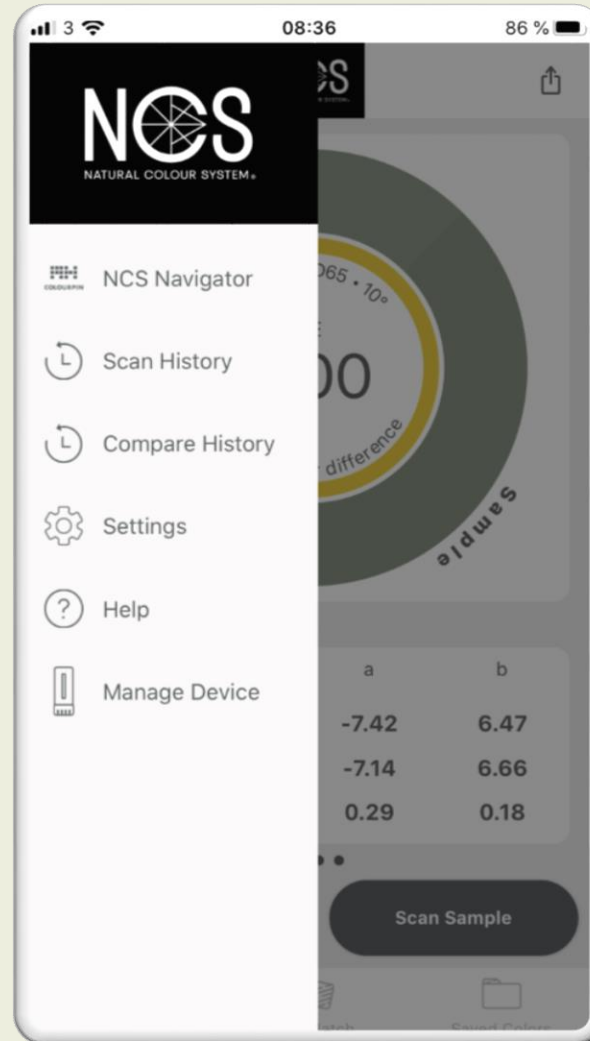
Compare Colours & Scan History

- The compare colours looks different
 - Delta E 2000 and D65 light is standard (you can select others in settings)
 - You get Lab difference but you can swipe and get LCH, RGB, CMYK values for Standard and Sample
- In the Scan History you can get the NCS notation on scanned colours and save a note per colour (super good!)
 - You can delete scanned colours, one or all of them



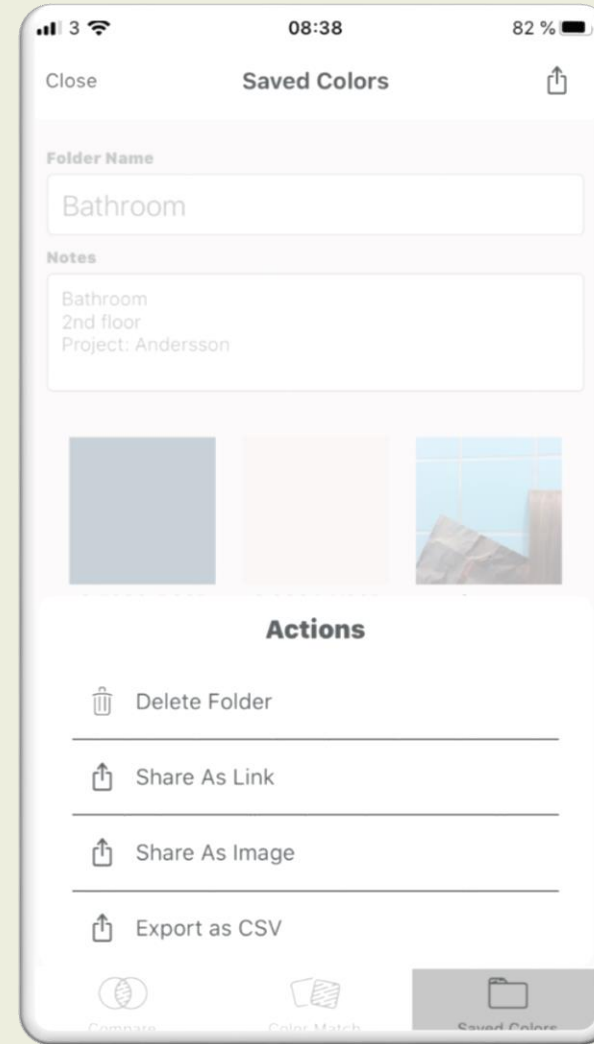
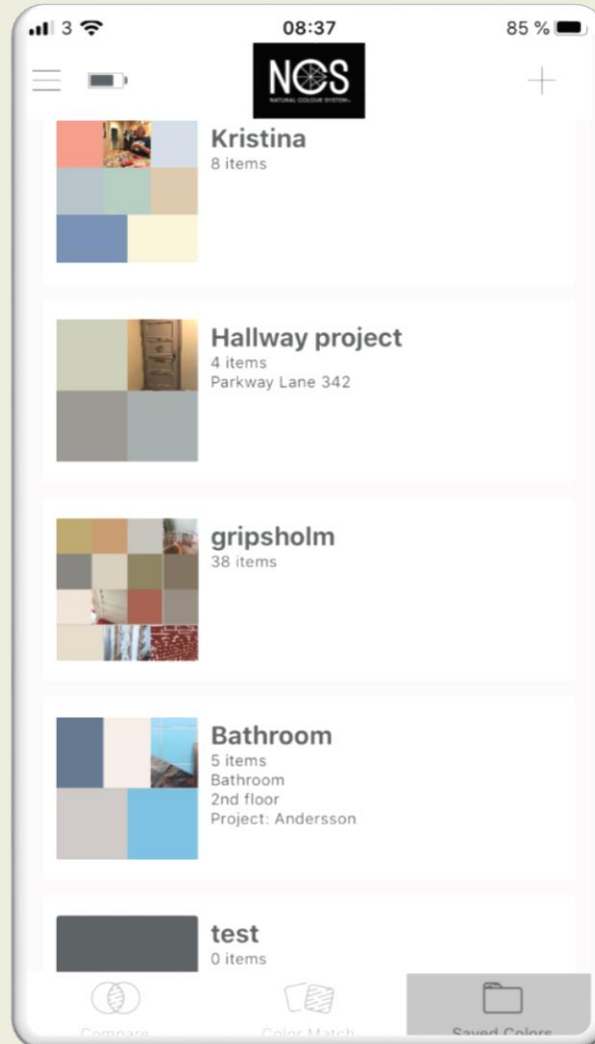
NCS Navigator

- A brand new feature in the app, NCS Navigator.
 - You can search NCS colours by turning the circle and move around in the triangle.
 - Select an NCS colour and click on it and change to the RAL database to get the closest RAL colour.
 - Note that the Neutral Colours are not in the NCS Navigator but will be added in next release.
 - Chroma will be updated, should be Chromaticness



Saved colours

- The Palettes / Saved Colours is more or less the same.
 - You click on top right corner to delete or share Saved Colours
 - CSV format is an Excel file with measurement values
